Thank you for continuing to consult with the New York State Historic Preservation Office (SHPO). We have reviewed the provided documentation in accordance with Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act of 1966. These comments are those of the SHPO and relate only to Historic/Cultural resources. They do not include other environmental impacts to New York State Parkland that may be involved in or near your project. Such impacts must be considered as part of the environmental review of the project pursuant to the National Environmental Policy Act and/or the State Environmental Quality Review Act (New York Environmental Conservation Law Article 8).

We have reviewed the response letter dated August 16, 2022, the DTOAD Area Building Heights plan received August 16, 2022, the Shadow Study dated July 18, 2022, the design drawings for the proposed development dated March 25, 2022, and the Context Study dated July 27, 2022. Based on that review, it is the SHPO's opinion that the proposed demolition of 20 South 2<sup>nd</sup> Avenue and development of the new mixed-use residential building complex, as described, will have No Adverse Effect on historic or archeological resources.
